Proposed Regulation NAC 408.182

- *(New) NAC 408.182- Defines the Term, “**Local Government**” as referenced in NRS 408.527 and proposed NAC 408.567*

Means-“The Legislative Body of any City or County”.



Proposed Regulation NAC 408.567

- *(New) NAC 408.567*
 1. *Requires the Department to work Collaboratively with Local Government to create a process to relinquish roads.*
 2. *Requires the development of a “Guide” that identifies the process of proposing, developing, evaluating and completing road relinquishments.*
 3. *Sets forth a process of revising or amending the guide, if necessary.*



Significant Point of Revision

NRS 408.527

- NRS 408.527 – Revised during the 2013 Legislative Session.
- Significant Revision-Required the Department of Transportation to work with Local Governments to develop procedural documents that would guide the process of relinquishments and then adopt regulations for its use.
