You are informed that the State of Nevada employs a force of State Police Officers whose duty it is to apprehend the violators of the Motor Vehicle Laws. You are therefore cautioned that these laws should be obeyed in order to avoid a possible loss of time and the usual unpleasant situations arising from arrest.

**DIGEST OF MOTOR VEHICLE LAWS**

**Licenses.** Must be obtained by resident owners prior to the third Monday in January, or within five days after buying new car. Fees must be sent to the Assessor of the county in which the applicant resides. Misfeasance to operate car without plates for current year.

**Visitors Permits.** Visitors from other States who have complied with the laws of home State are permitted to remain in Nevada for 30 days before procuring Nevada license. However, within 10 days after arrival, they must register with the Secretary of State, the Assessor of any county, or the Nevada Highway Association at Reno, and obtain visitor's permit. Home registration certificate must be presented for stamping when permit is requested. No charge for permit.

**Speed.** Reasonable and proper speed, having regard to traffic, nature of road, etc., must be maintained; 45 miles maximum.

**Plates.** Two plates, one at each end, must be carried in plain view. Do not conceal plates behind baggage or bumpers. Fictitious plates are unlawful. If one plate be lost or destroyed, it becomes the duty of the owner to return the remaining plate to the issuing officer, with an affidavit setting forth the fact that the other plate was lost or destroyed, with a fee of \$1, whereupon a new set of plates will be issued.

**Lights.** Must be alighted in face of approaching traffic or cars must be equipped with lenses that keep the light below a line 42 inches above the road.

**Drivers.** Intoxicated, incompetent or incapable persons, or persons under the age of 15 years are prohibited from driving automobiles on any road.

**Enforcement.** All peace officers of the State are required to enforce the Motor Vehicle Act, particularly in respect to registration. The State Police also constitute a special enforcement detail.

**Transfer of Ownership.** When a vehicle is transferred, it becomes the duty of the former owner to return at once the registration certificate to the Assessor with a fee of 50 cents, whereupon the registration will be transferred to the new owner.

**Resolving Acc.** When a driver of any vehicle strikes another vehicle or person, he shall stop immediately and give his name and address and the number of his vehicle. If required or requested, he shall give any aid that may be necessary, including the carrying of the injured person or persons to medical or surgical treatment.

**Maximum Weight.** No vehicle permitted to be operated when total weight of vehicle and load exceeds 25,000 pounds when equipped with four wheels running on the highway, or 30,000 pounds when equipped with six wheels and three axles, no two of which are less than 36 inches apart. Maximum weight per inch of tire cannot exceed 800 pounds.

**Brakes.** Efficient brakes must be maintained at all times. When driving in mountains always keep car in gear when descending grades.

This map is issued in accordance with the Statutes of the State of Nevada establishing the Department of Highways, and is intended primarily for the use of the Department of Highways. This map is intended also to give the traveling public a fair representation of the highways as they exist in this State. Improved highways are shown by a wide solid line, there being no distinction made among the different types of improvement. Highways which are improved, but not to the same standard, are shown by a narrow solid line. Unimproved roads are shown by a dotted line. The roads thus shown are in general old narrow dirt roads which as yet have received little or no attention. No pretense is made on this map to show the condition of such roads.

No particular attempt is made on this map to show natural features or topography. Counties are outlined but not named. For further information concerning the State of Nevada the reader is referred to the Department of Highways.
