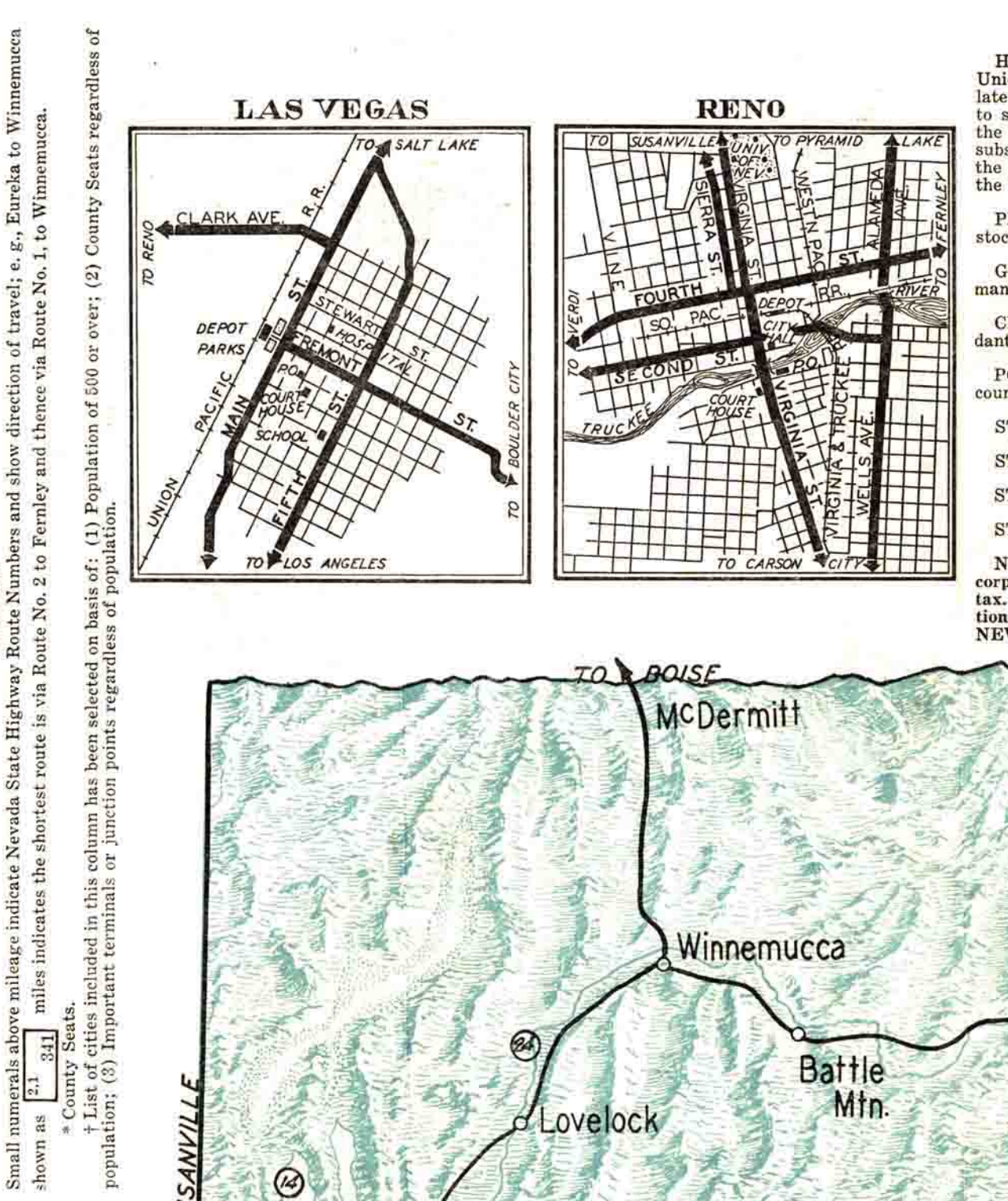


NEVADA MILEAGE TABLE

NEVADA FACTS

HISTORY—Nevada, the sixth largest state in the Union, was originally a part of Utah territory, and later a territory in her own name before her admission to statehood on October 31, 1864. The discovery of the Comstock Lode in Virginia City in 1859 with its subsequent impregnating of gold and silver sustained the credit of the United States Government during the Civil War.

PRINCIPAL INDUSTRIES—Mining, agriculture, stock raising.

GEOGRAPHY—Rugged mountains, sagebrush mantled deserts, and fertile valleys near water sources.

CLIMATE—Dry, stimulating, healthful with abundant sunshine.

POPULATION—100,000 (Est. 1936). Number constant.

STATE CAPITAL—Carson City.

STATE UNIVERSITY—At Reno.

STATE MOTTO—All For Our Country.

STATE FLOWER—Sagebrush.

NEVADA TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

VISITOR'S PERMIT—Must be secured by non-resident owners of motor vehicles within five days after commencing to operate within the State. Permits issued by County Assessors free of charge.

LICENSE PLATES—Must be conspicuously displayed on motor vehicles and trailers at all times.

OPERATOR'S LICENSE—Is required for each driver of a motor vehicle. License may be obtained from county assessors free of charge. This license must be in the driver's possession at all times when driving a motor vehicle and shall be shown upon demand of an officer of the law.

MINORS—Under fifteen years of age are not permitted to drive a motor vehicle. The legal guardian of a minor making application for a driver's license must sign the application.

SPEED LIMIT—Reasonable and proper with due regard to traffic and road conditions. This applies to slow moving traffic also as it is a recognized fact that an unreasonably slow rate of speed impedes traffic and is a frequent cause of accidents.

ACCIDENTS—Immediate first aid and all necessary assistance must be given to persons injured in automobile accidents and a report made to an officer of the law.

DRUNKEN DRIVING—If you drink, don't drink; if you drink, don't drive. It is a misdemeanor carrying a mandatory jail sentence to drive a motor vehicle while under the influence of liquor or stimulating or stupefying drugs. It is a felony if death or bodily injury results from the acts of an intoxicated driver.

CLOSED ROADS—To pass over a road which is closed to traffic, or to remove a sign or barrier indicating that such road is closed, is a misdemeanor. Park your car completely off the roadway. Do not double park. Stop engine while getting gas. Descend grades with gears in mesh. Drive on right side of highway. Dim your lights when meeting an approaching vehicle. Use standard hand signals for changing direction. Sound horn. Upon overtaking a car or approaching curves, crests of hills and intersections where visibility is obscured. Check lights and brakes frequently. Observe traffic warnings and signs. Please practice courtesy and drive safely.
