We welcome your STATE OF NEVADA, DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS Thraslen State Highway Engineer, TRAFFIC REGULATIONS IN NEVADA Visitor's Permit—Nonresident owners of motor vehi-cles shall within five days after commencing to operate within the State apply for nonresident permit. License Plates Displayed—License number plates must be conspicuously displayed on all motor vehicles at all times. Operator's License Required—Every person who drives a motor vehicle in Nevada is required to have a driver's license. Apply at State Highway Department, Drivers License Division Office. License Division Office.

Licenses Available At All Times—Drivers license shall be in immediate possession at all times. Licenses of other States are generally recognized.

Regulation For Minors—No person under 16 years of age is permitted to drive a motor vehicle in Nevada.

Speed Limit—It is unlawful to drive a motor vehicle at a rate of speed greater than that which is reasonable and proper, having due regard for traffic, surface, and width of highways.

Collision—Immediate assistance must be given to any Collision—Immediate assistance must be given to any person or persons injured in a collision; a full report of any collision shall be made to Sheriff, municipal authority, or State Police.

Intoxicated Drivers—Driving a motor vehicle in Nevada while under influence of intoxicants or drugs is a misdemeanor. Such an act of negligence which causes death is a felony. Parking Cars—Be sure to park your car clear off the roadway while making repairs or adjustments.

Descend Grades With Gears In Mesh—It is unlawful in Nevada to drive a motor vehicle while descending a grade with the gears out of mesh. Stop Engines While Getting Gas-That is the Nevada Changes of Direction Signals—Drivers shall, before changing direction or stopping, give the proper signals for direction and stops.

Dim Your Lights—When an approaching car nears, going in opposite direction.

Mechanical Equipment Bequirements—Nevada law requires that brakes be in good condition; also that the car has a suitable horn. car has a suitable horn.

Sounding Horns—A lawful signaling device shall in all cases be sounded in passing other cars going in like direction, and at intersecting highways in the country, or wherever operator's view is obstructed.

Headlights—At least two white headlights and one red tail light are required. Trucks and trailers shall have standard regulation lights, front, rear, and side. Keep Your Driving Lane—Stay in your own driving lane on the right when approaching a curve or crest of a hill. Warning signs must be observed. WATCH THE LINES MARKED ON THE PAVEMENTS!
