- 3. PUBLIC COMMENT AND CITIZENS PARTICIPATION:** No action may be taken on any matter discussed under this item that is not listed on this Agenda, although the NBPAB can direct that such items be placed on a future agenda.

At this time, any citizen in the audience may address the NBPAB on any matter. No vote can be taken on a matter not listed on the posted agenda; however, the NBPAB can direct that the matter be placed on a future agenda.

Each citizen must be recognized by the Chairperson. The citizen is then to approach the microphone to state his or her name, and to spell the last name for the record. The Chairperson may limit remarks if such remarks are disruptive to the meeting or not within the NBPAB's jurisdiction.

The Nevada Department of Transportation keeps the official record of all proceedings of the meeting. In order to maintain a complete and accurate record, copies of documents used during a presentation must be submitted to the Recording Secretary.

The Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board appreciates the time citizens devote to be involved in this important process.

Public comment is limited to 5 minutes per person.

Agenda items may be taken out of the order presented on the agenda at the discretion of the chairperson. The Board may combine two or more agenda items for consideration. The Board may remove an item from the agenda or delay discussion relating to an agenda item at any time. The Board may make reasonable restrictions on time, place, and manner but will not restrict the comments based upon viewpoint.

4. **Approval of the January 18th, 2018 minutes (for possible action)**
Action may be taken to approve the January 18th, 2018 meeting minutes.

General Meeting Items.

Presentations are limited to 10 minutes per presenter.

5. **Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Update** *Bill Story*

The Nevada State Department of Transportation (NDOT) is making available \$6 million in federal funding to support bicycle, pedestrian, multi-use path and transportation-related projects. The deadline for Applications for the FY 2019-2020 funding were due no later than February 26, 2018. An overview of the status of this program will be given.

6. **Crash reporting for bicyclists and pedestrians** *Albert Jacquez and Ken Mammen (for possible action)*

The development of informational card for use by bicyclists or pedestrians who have been involved in a crash was proposed at a prior meeting. The alternative of entering crashes and near misses to the NDOT Traffic Safety Crash Data website was also discussed. The NDOT Traffic Safety's Crash Data Website was developed by the Nevada Department of Transportation-Traffic Safety Engineering Division, in cooperation with the Information Technology Division and the Department of Public Safety- Office of Traffic Safety and Enterprise IT Services. The site provides a platform for data analysis which can be applied to decrease the number and severity of crashes on our roadways. An update on the status of this proposal will be given. Action may be taken to provide an advisory recommendation.

7. **Update on Pedestrian safety improvements along Boulder Highway (for possible action)** *Lori Campbell – NDOT Safety Engineering*

A series of pedestrian safety improvements along Boulder Highway will be discussed. Eight intersections are expected to be reconfigured, between Fremont Street in downtown Las Vegas and Racetrack Road in Henderson. Action may be taken to provide an advisory endorsement of the proposed improvements.

7. **Status on the proposed new U.S. Bike Route Plan**

The purpose of the U.S. bicycle route numbering and marking system is to Facilitate travel between the states over routes which have been identified as being more suitable than others for cycling. The system, once fully connected, is projected to encompass over 50,000 miles of bike routes.

8. **Report from the 2018 National Bicycle Summit held in Washington D.C.** *Cathy Balcon, Kelly Clark and Janice Keillor*
The NDOT funded NBPAB members and staff to attend the 2018 National Bicycle Summit held on March 5-7, 2018, in Washington D.C. The National Bicycle Summit is an annual gathering of bicycling organizations and advocates. A report of what new items and issues of national interest were presented at the summit will be given.

9. **Reports from the Bicycle and Pedestrian Programs Statewide**
An update of projects and initiatives being worked on by the NDOT and the two large Metropolitan Planning Areas will be given.

10. **Board Member Reports**
Reports will be provided from NBPAB members on activities, initiatives or issues specific to their sectors occurring since the last meeting on January 18th, 2018 .

11. **Schedule and prepare items to be placed on the next agenda (For possible action)** The next NBPAB meeting is proposed to be scheduled for May 17th 2018. Items of interest to NBPAB may be agendaized for a future meeting, including items mentioned during the Board Member Reports.
