Tonopah Complete Streets Improvement Project Public Information Meeting

Public input sought on proposed future safety improvements along US 6/ US 95 in Tonopah, NV

PURPOSE OF MEETING

The Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) is proposing concepts to enhance safety along the US 6/US 95 corridor in Nye County, NV. The purpose of this effort is to identify and evaluate safety improvements for the approximately three miles of US 6/ US 95, from Cemetery Road to the Tonopah High School. Concepts will be presented to include restriping for one through lane in each direction with a center turn lane.

Proposed roadway improvements within the corridor include:

- Roadway reconstruction/restriping
- Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) improvements throughout the corridor and extending to the Tonopah High School
- Rapid response flashing beacon crosswalk signs at three locations
- Stormdrain improvements
- Enhanced lighting
- Roadside aesthetic treatments at key locations
- Designated turn lanes, acceleration/deceleration lanes
