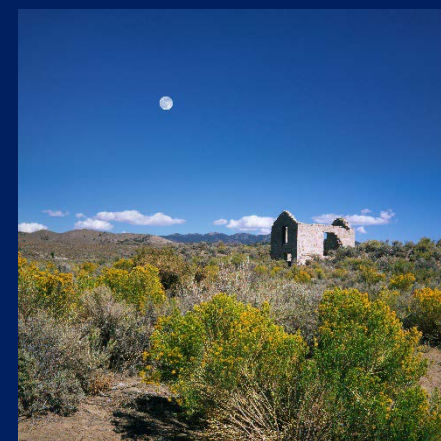

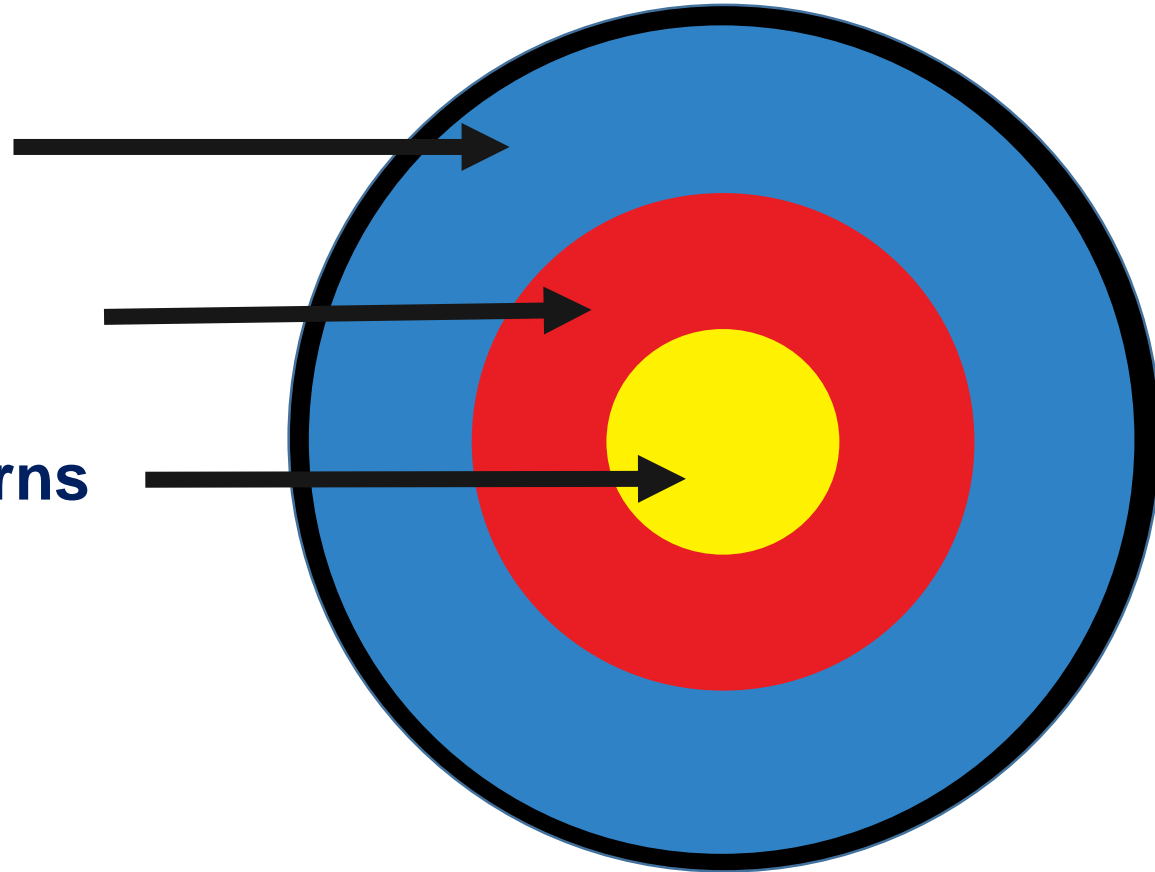

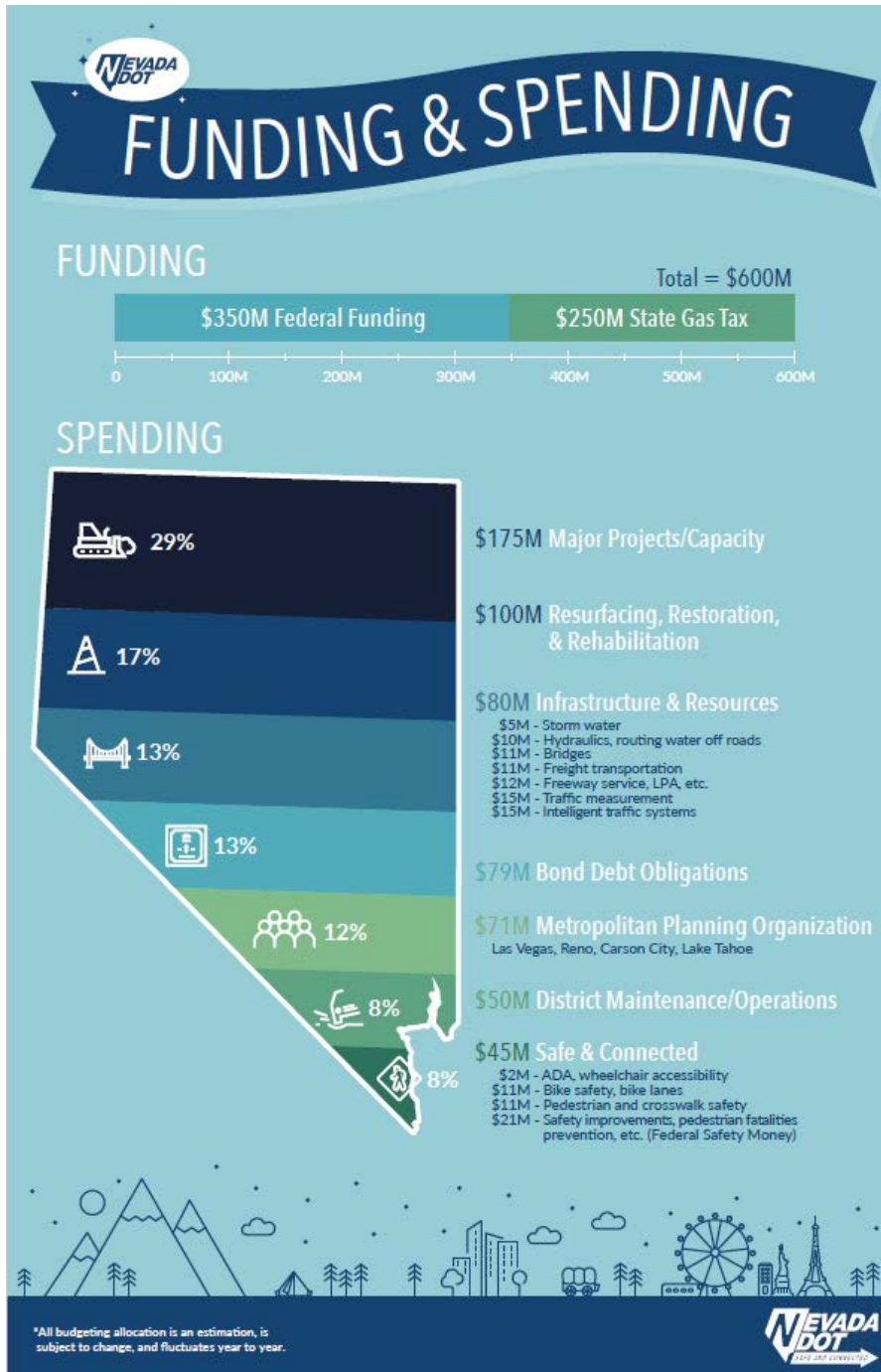

# County Infographics – How a Project Moves Through NDOT

## 12 STEP DESIGN BID BUILD PROJECT PROCESS

**1. PLANA**  
PLANA is the entry point for new project ideas or concerns to help begin the project process and shows how move projects forward.

**2. Scoping**  
Scoping will define the project, providing preliminary cost information and help turn an identified need into a potential project solution.

**3. Project Development Committee**  
This committee evaluates projects and makes priority based decisions on which projects should move forward.

**4. Environmental Review**  
Projects will undergo an environmental review to evaluate cultural and environmental concerns before moving forward.

**5. Preliminary Engineering**  
Preliminary Engineering is analysis and design work to produce construction plans, specifications and cost estimates.

**6. Right of Way**  
Projects that need to acquire land must go through the Right of Way process. This process takes approximately 2 years.

**7. Review of Plans**  
This is a review of all plans to meet consistent guidelines and regulations to ensure safety and consistency.

**8. Contract Advertised**  
The project will be advertised to potential contractors to bid on the project.

**9. Contractor Bid Opening**  
NDOT gathers cost estimates from contractors to evaluate the best contractor for the project construction.

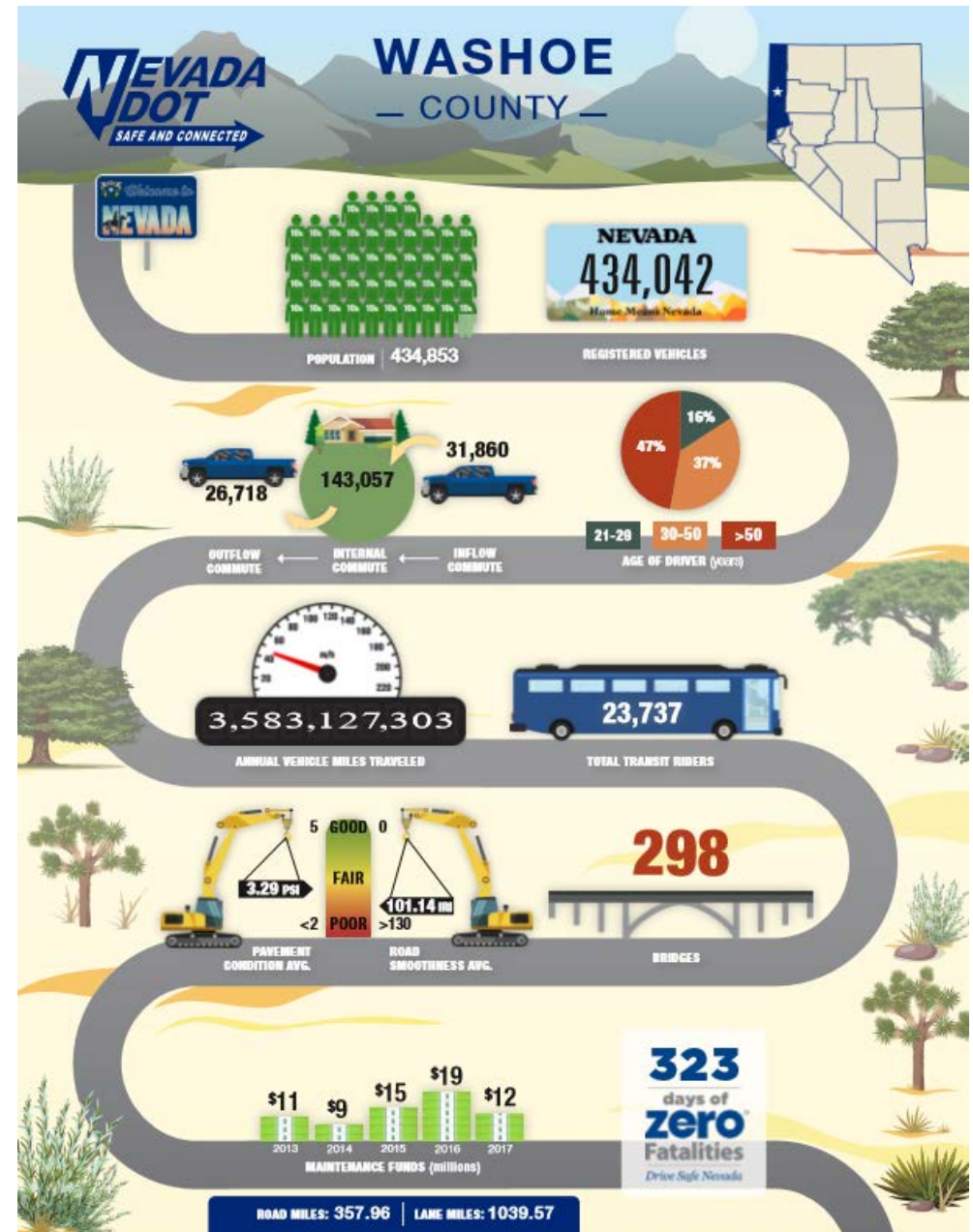
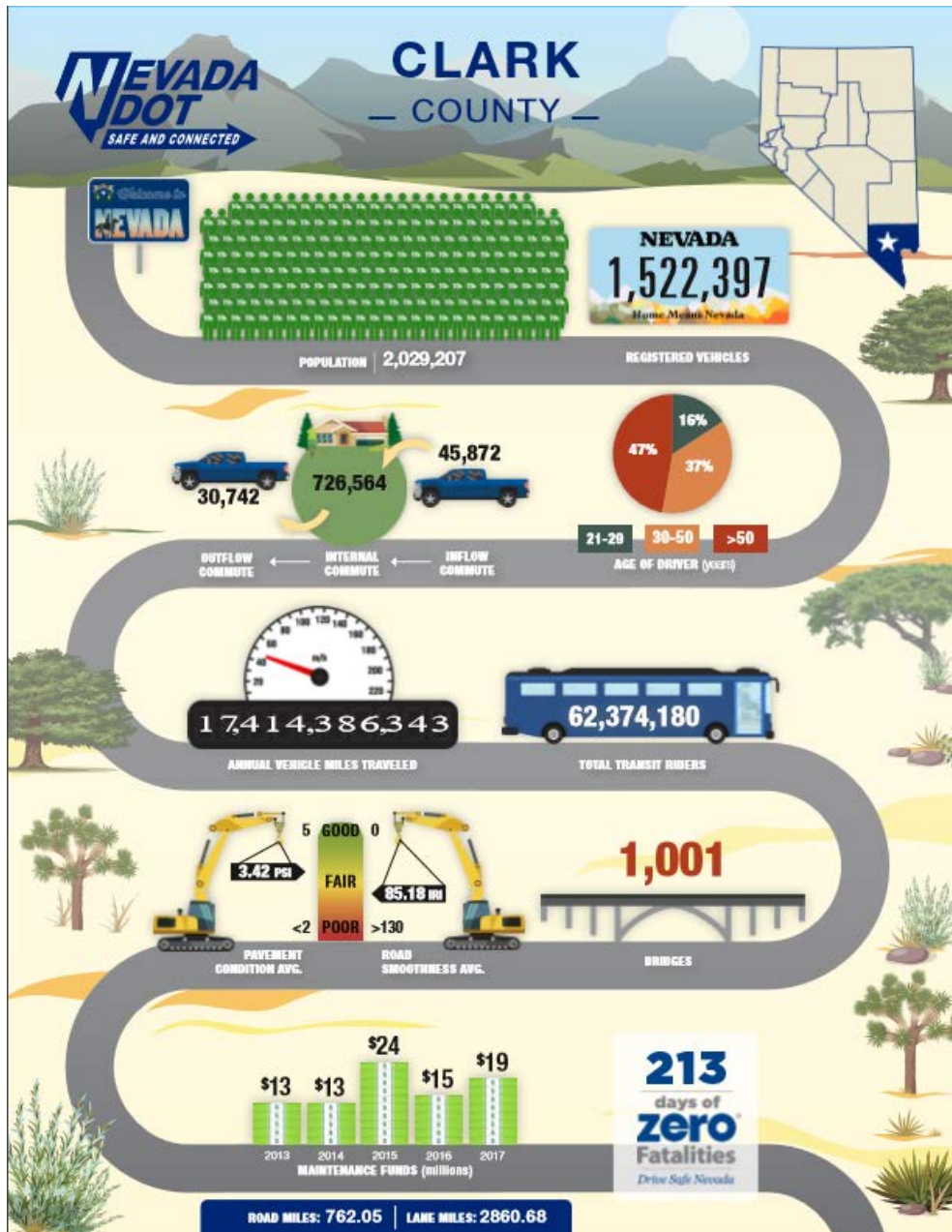
**10. Contract Awarded**  
When the estimates are in and validated the contract is awarded to the vendor for the project.

**11. Construction**  
Once the contractor is selected, the details and the specifics of the project are approved. The physical construction phase of the project begins.

**12. District Approval**  
Once the project is completed the district approves the project and accepts the responsibility to maintain this project in the outlying years.

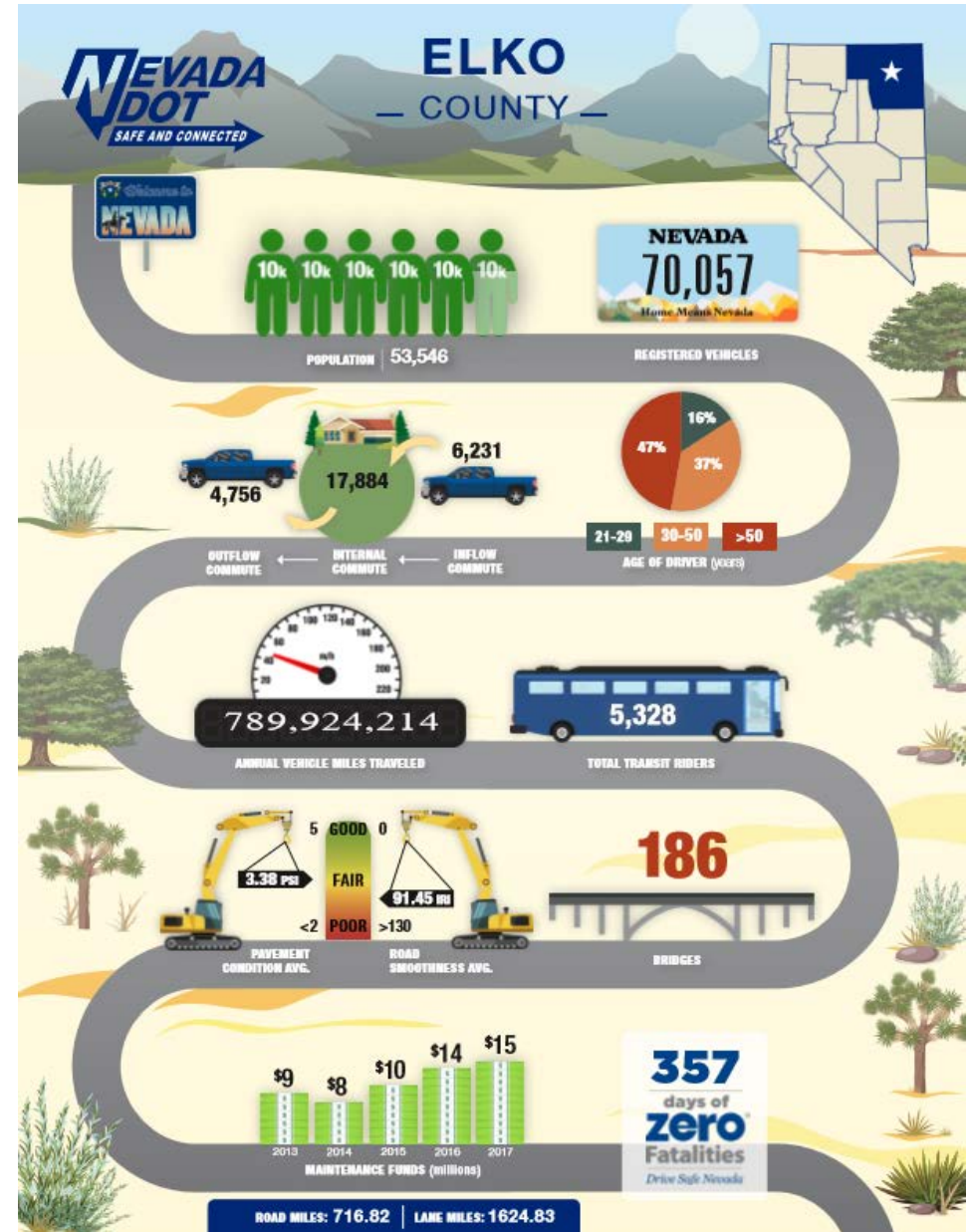
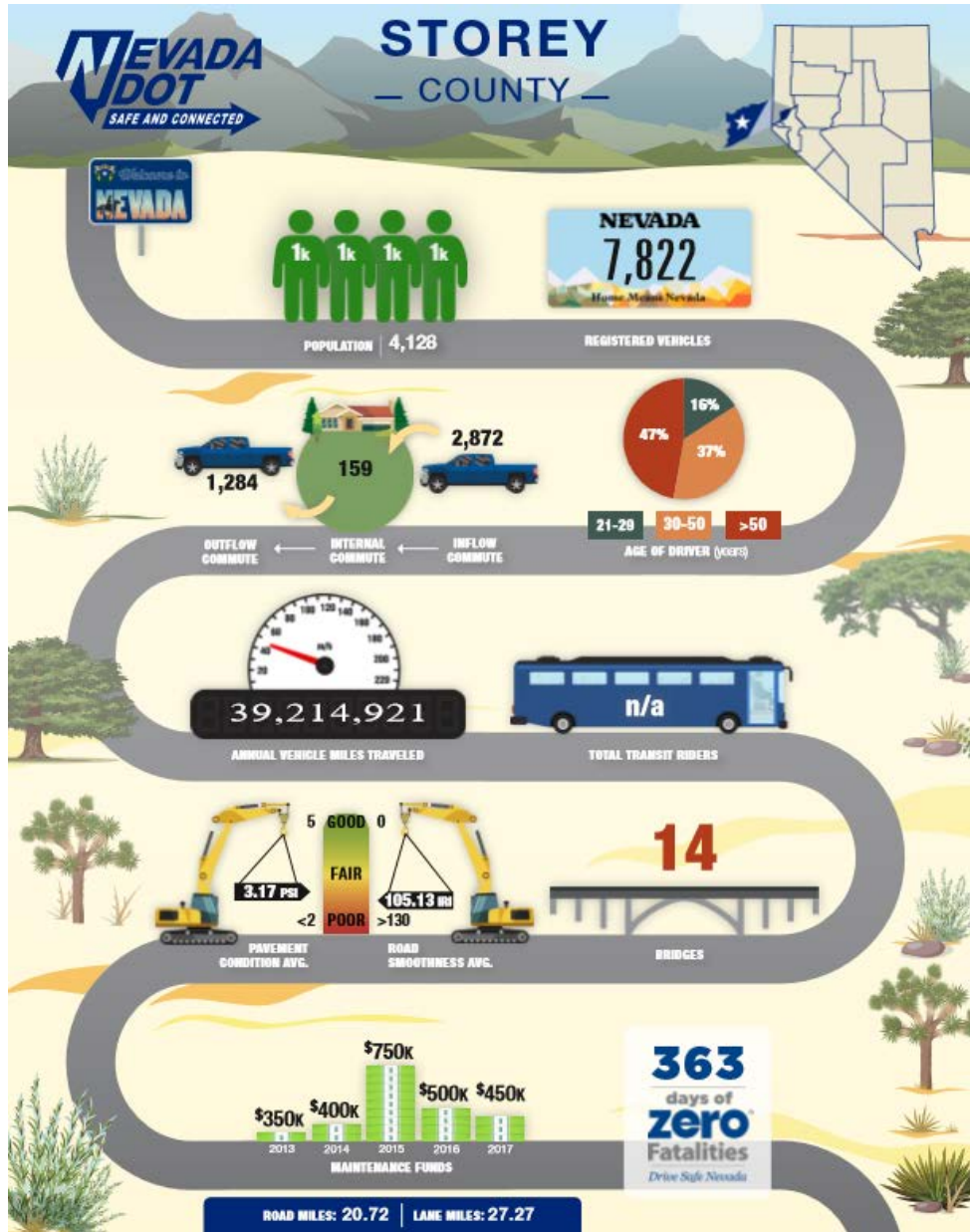
