

FEDERAL UPDATE

- PREPARING A BUILD ACT GRANT APPLICATION
 FOR I-580 EARLY ACTION PROJECT IN RENO.
- \$1.5 BILLION IN INFRA GRANTS (PREVIOUSLY KNOWN AS FASTLANE) ANNOUNCED BY USDOT; SUBJECT TO CONGRESSIONAL REVIEW IN THE NEXT 60 DAYS
 - FY 17 AND FY 18 WERE COMBINED
 - NEVADA DID NOT RECEIVE AN AWARD
 - 23 STATES RECEIVED AWARDS





FEDERAL UPDATE

- US SENATE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE PASSES FFY 19 BUDGET.
- HOUSE PASSED THEIR VERSION OF FFY 19 APPROPRIATIONS BILL
- WE ARE OPTIMISTIC THAT CONGRESS WILL PASS FFY 19 APPROPRIATIONS BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30TH ONCE THEY RECONCILE THEIR DIFFERENCES

- NDOT GOAL IS TO KEEP THE DRAFT EIS FOR RENO SPAGHETTI BOWL ON SCHEDULE; WANT TO RECEIVE FHWA RECORD OF DECISION (ROD) ON THE RENO SPAGHETTI BOWL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT (EIS) IN MID 2019
- WORK ON AIRPORT ACCESS SOLUTION THAT COULD GO INTO THE FINAL EIS
- CHIEF ENGINEER COLE MORTENSEN PRESENTING TO AIRPORT BOARD ON JUNE 14TH

- REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS RELEASED;
 RESPONSES ARE DUE JULY 16, 2018
- RECORD OF DECISION (ROD) FOR SPAGHETTI BOWL EIS WILL COVER THE EARLY ACTION PROJECT
- TIMING OF ROD DOES NOT DELAY EARLY ACTION PROJECT
- PROJECT IS SUBJECT TO GOVERNOR'S FINANCE OFFICE AND 2019 LEGISLATIVE APPROVAL FOR BONDING

PROJECT NEON BONDING

- \$140 MILLION BOND ISSUANCE PREVIOUSLY APPROVED IN MARCH 2018
- AAA RATING FROM S&P
- 6 BIDDERS, 3.3% RATE, BANK OF AMERICA WAS THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER
- STATE TREASURER ANNOUNCED SIGNIFICANT SAVINGS BY DELIVERING PROJECT NEON 18 YEARS SOONER WITH A BONDING APPROACH



STADIUM AND MGM MEETING ON HACIENDA HOV RAMP

- DIRECTOR MALFABON AND PM DIVISION STAFF MET WITH MGM AND STADIUM DEVELOPER ON JUNE 1st
- MGM CONCERN CONSIDERING STADIUM LOCATION AND CURRENT LAYOUT OF MGM PROPERTIES, IT'S NO LONGER THE BEST LOCATION FOR THE HOV RAMP IN MGM's OPINION
- STADIUM CONCERN AVOID CONSTRUCTION ON HACIENDA AFTER AUGUST 2020 OPENING
- PRIMARY PED ACCESS FOR STADIUM EVENTS WILL BE VIA CLOSING HACIENDA BRIDGE (ALLOW ONE LANE FOR TRANSIT)

STADIUM AND MGM MEETING ON HACIENDA HOV RAMP

- BENEFITS OF REVISING HOV PLAN TO ELIMINATE HACIENDA:
 - AVOIDS EXPENSE OF COMPLETE REMOVAL AND REPLACEMENT OF HACIENDA BRIDGE OVER I-15 (ABOUT 25 YEARS OLD)
 - ALLOWS NDOT TO CONSIDER A MORE OPTIMAL LOCATION FOR NB I-15 HOV OFFRAMP (HARMON?)
- CONCERNS ON REVISING HOV PLAN TO ELIMINATE HACIENDA:
 - POSSIBLE IMPACT TO NEPA SCHEDULE FOR TROPICANA INTERCHANGE; EARLY 2019





SOUTHERN NV PROJECTS

- RTC OF SOUTHERN NEVADA WILL HOLD GROUNDBREAKING EVENT FOR THEIR I-11 PHASE 2 PROJECT ON AUGUST 9TH
- BOARD WILL CONSIDER AWARDING BLUE DIAMOND ROAD PHASE 2 WIDENING AND REPAVING BIDS AWARD NEXT MONTH AFTER BID ANALYSIS IS COMPLETE
 - APPARENT LOW BIDDER IS AGGREGATE INDUSTRIES, \$58.6
 MILLION
- US 95/CC 215 CENTENNIAL BOWL PHASE 3C IS ADVERTISED FOR BIDS; BID OPENING JUNE 28TH
 - ENGINEER'S ESTIMATE IS IN THE \$49 59 MILLION RANGE

- NO SETTLEMENTS AT JUNE 12TH BOE
- NASSIRI vs. NDOT NASSIRI REQUEST FOR REHEARING OF NEVADA SUPREME COURT DECISION WAS NOT GRANTED; NDOT WILL REQUEST NASSIRI PAY LEGAL COSTS AND FEES
