The Nevada Department of Agriculture (NDA) is responsible for the regulation of noxious weeds. The NDA Noxious Weed Program was created to not only uphold Nevada Revised Statute 555, Control of Insects, Pests, and Noxious Weeds, but to help landowners and managers with noxious weed control.
