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- 1. Action to call meeting to order**
- 2. Roll call of NBPAB members**
- 3. PUBLIC COMMENT AND CITIZENS PARTICIPATION:** No action may be taken on any matter discussed under this item that is not listed on this Agenda, although the NBPAB can direct that such items be placed on a future agenda.

At this time, any citizen in the audience may address the NBPAB on any matter. No vote can be taken on a matter not listed on the posted agenda; however, the NBPAB can direct that the matter be placed on a future agenda.

Each citizen must be recognized by the Chairperson. The citizen is then to approach the microphone to state his or her name, and to spell the last name for the record. The Chairperson may limit remarks if such remarks are disruptive to the meeting or not within the NBPAB's jurisdiction.

The Nevada Department of Transportation keeps the official record of all proceedings of the meeting. In order to maintain a complete and accurate record, copies of documents used during a presentation must be submitted to the Recording Secretary.

The Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board appreciates the time citizens devote to be involved in this important process.

Public comment is limited to 5 minutes per person.

Agenda items may be taken out of the order presented on the agenda at the discretion of the chairperson. The Board may combine two or more agenda items for consideration. The Board may remove an item from the agenda or delay discussion relating to an agenda item at any time. The Board may make reasonable restrictions on time, place, and manner but will not restrict the comments based upon viewpoint.

- 4. Approval of the May 17th, 2018 minutes (for possible action)**
Action may be taken to approve the May 17th, 2018 meeting minutes.

General Meeting Items.

Presentations are limited to 10 minutes per presenter.

- 5. Review of Tonopah complete streets. Victor Peters (for possible action)**
Complete Streets design is an approach or policy used within the transportation industry to promote street networks for all users, not just the accommodation of vehicles. An update on the status of complete street projects in Tonopah will be presented. Action may be taken to provide advisory recommendation in support of this complete streets project in Tonopah.
- 6. Report on Recreational Trails Program funding update. Janice Keillor**
The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) makes discretionary funding available to states which can be used for recreational trail projects and programs. These funds are available to local entities via a competitive state funding program administered by the Nevada Division of State Parks. An update on upcoming available grants and grant training will be presented..
- 7. Discussion of legality of bicycles on sidewalks Ron Floth (for possible action)**
Nevada law does not specifically authorize nor prohibit the operation of a bicycle upon a sidewalk; however, local government entities may enact their own ordinances or municipal codes regarding a prohibition. A presentation on the many recent inquiries and confusion on this topic will be given. Action may be taken to provide an advisory recommendation to applicable state agencies.
- 8. License Plate Grant Status – Albert Jacquez (for possible action)**
An update on the current license plate grant awardees. Discussion concerning whether to award future grants using current license plate funds and, if so, determine the best time to meet to establish such grants. Action may be taken to vote on whether to issue future grants.
- 9. Electric Bicycle Overview Gabriel Sheer- LimeBike**
Bicycles equipped with small electric motors have emerged as a growing industry trend over the last few years. These conveyances were recognized under Nevada law in 2009. While their share of the industry market is still small, their introduction has brought to light a number of issues, concerns, and opportunities, whether perceived or real, related to their place in transportation and recreation. A presentation of the state of this segment of the bicycle market will be given.

10. **“Close Call” Data Collection Pilot Project – Ken Mammen (for possible action)**
The NDOT is developing a web-based data platform whereby non-crash incidents that are “close calls” may be submitted into the database by the public. An overview and discussion of the pilot project will be presented. Action may be taken to provide advisory recommendation to appropriate agencies regarding this project.

11. **Reports from the Bicycle and Pedestrian Programs Statewide**
An update of projects and initiatives being worked on by the NDOT and the two large Metropolitan Planning Areas will be given.

12. **Board Member Reports**
Reports will be provided from NBPAB members on activities, initiatives or issues specific to their sectors occurring since the last meeting on May 17th, 2018.

13. **Schedule and prepare items to be placed on the next agenda (For possible action)**
The next NBPAB meeting is proposed to be scheduled for September 20th, 2018. Items of interest to NBPAB may be agenized for a future meeting, including items mentioned during the Board Member Reports. Action may be taken to change the next meeting date and time to coordinate with attendance at INTERBIKE and the Walk, Bike Places conferences.
