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- 1. Action to call meeting to order**
- 2. Roll call of NBPAB members**
- 3. PUBLIC COMMENT AND CITIZENS PARTICIPATION:** No action may be taken on any matter discussed under this item that is not listed on this Agenda, although the NBPAB can direct that such items be placed on a future agenda.

At this time, any citizen in the audience may address the NBPAB on any matter. No vote can be taken on a matter not listed on the posted agenda; however, the NBPAB can direct that the matter be placed on a future agenda.

Each citizen must be recognized by the Chairperson. The citizen is then to approach the microphone to state his or her name, and to spell the last name for the record. The Chairperson may limit remarks if such remarks are disruptive to the meeting or not within the NBPAB's jurisdiction.

The Nevada Department of Transportation keeps the official record of all proceedings of the meeting. In order to maintain a complete and accurate record, copies of documents used during a presentation must be submitted to the Recording Secretary.

The Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board appreciates the time citizens devote to be involved in this important process.

Public comment is limited to 5 minutes per person.

Agenda items may be taken out of the order presented on the agenda at the discretion of the chairperson. The Board may combine two or more agenda items for consideration. The Board may remove an item from the agenda or delay discussion relating to an agenda item at any time. The Board may make reasonable restrictions on time, place, and manner but will not restrict the comments based upon viewpoint.

- 4. Approval of the November 15th, 2018 minutes (for possible action)**
Action may be taken to approve the November 15th, 2018 meeting minutes.

General Meeting Items.

Presentations are limited to 10 minutes per presenter.

- 5. Annual election of the Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board Officers for Chairperson and Vice Chairperson (for possible action)**
The Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board elections are held each January. Action may be taken to elect a Chairman and Vice-Chairman for the 2019 calendar year.
- 6. Presentation of the "Be Safe, Be Seen" project (for possible action)- Rebecca Barnett, Priyasha Landry**
The "Be Safe, Be Seen" project, is a project Priyasha Landry and her Girl Scout team put together, allowing students to pick up flags and alert drivers before they walk across the street. A presentation on this proposed project will be given. Action may be taken to draft a letter of support.
- 7. Discussion on combining the Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Summit**
The Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Summit is an annual meeting focused on issues affecting bicyclists and pedestrians. Discussion will take place on the opportunity of combining the Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Summit with another conference or summit initiative in 2019.
- 8. Review of safety education strategies Albert Jacquez**
A discussion will take place to help identify more effective methods of safety education strategies
- 9. Report on Joining Forces Program Rebecca Barnett – Office of Traffic Safety**
Joining Forces is a multi-jurisdictional law enforcement program that promotes statewide enforcement in the areas of impaired or distracted driving, pedestrian safety, speeding, and seat belt use. A report on statistics from the program will be given.
- 10. Report on Recreational Trails Program funding update. Janice Keillor**
The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) makes discretionary funding available to states which can be used for recreational trail projects and programs. These funds are available to local entities via a competitive state funding program administered by the Nevada Division of State Parks. An update on grants funded will be presented.

- 11. Discussion and update of emerging technologies related to micro-mobility***Ron Floth*
Nevada is seeing an increase in new personal traveling conveyances
A discussion and update will take place on issues, concerns, and opportunities.
- 12. Report on Share the Road Specialty License Plates and Grant Program**
Albert Jacquez
The NBPAB developed a “Share the Road” specialty license plate to provide additional funding for local bicycle and pedestrian initiatives throughout the state. Funds are made available through a competitive grant process administered by the NDOT. An update of the status of the 2019 grant cycle, will be given.
- 13. Electric Bicycle Overview update from BLM** *Ron Floth*
Bicycles equipped with small electric motors have emerged as a growing industry trend over the last few years. These conveyances were recognized under Nevada law in 2009. While their share of the industry market is still small, their introduction has brought to light a number of issues, concerns, and opportunities, whether or not perceived or real, related to their place in transportation and recreation systems. An update on this segment of the bicycle industry will be given.
- 14. Legislative Update** *Bill Story, Jamie Borino*
An update will be provided concerning known, proposed legislation pertaining to bicyclists and pedestrians for the 2019 Session.
- 15. Reports from the Bicycle and Pedestrian Programs Statewide**
An update of projects and initiatives being worked on by the NDOT and the two large Metropolitan Planning Areas will be given.
- 16. Board Member Reports**
Reports will be provided from NBPAB members on activities, initiatives or issues specific to their sectors occurring since the last meeting on November 15th, 2018.
- 17. Schedule and prepare items to be placed on the next agenda (for possible action)**
The next NBPAB meeting is proposed to be scheduled for March 21st, 2019. Items of interest to NBPAB may be agenzized for a future meeting, including items mentioned during the Board Member Reports. Action may be taken to change the next meeting date and time.
