




History of Coordinated Plans

- Why are plans developed?
 - To improve transportation services for people with disabilities, older adults and individuals with low incomes
 - To ensure that communities coordinate transportation resources that are provided through multiple Federal programs





• Requirements of the Plan Are a Result of:

- 2003 General Accounting Office Report Identifying:
 62 Different Federal Funding Programs
 - 8 Different Federal Funding Agencies
- 2005 2009 SAFETEA-LU was Signed into Law
- 2012 2015 MAP-21
- 2015- FAST Act replaced MAP-21 and provided funding from FY2016-2020

Q3 Do you, or a family member, have any difficulty getting the transportation you need?





Q4 What transportation have you or your family used during the past 12 months to travel to places like work, appointments, shopping, classes or social activities? Check all that apply.



Q5 If you do not use a public transportation service, why not? Check all that apply.






Q11 Is English your primary language?

I come from a rural community In northern Nevada. And now live in a rural community in southern Nevada. Here in Laughlin they have the Silver Rider which I'm not sure runs under contract of NDOT but the system works pretty good. I would love to see the same in Winnemucca. I remember needing transportation to and fro for about 6 months in the middle of winter when my car was broke down. I would walk from one end of Winnemucca Blvd to the other for work. Not that the walk was bad per say but in winter even a 3 mile stretch can have multiple weather systems. Often getting to work half drenched and praying the entire time to not get splashed with mud. Here in Laughlin they have about 4 busses and only run 2 at a time. One each direction on a hour long route. Winnemucca is more spread out but even running 3 for hr stretch would do the trick. Here it's about 2 dollars for everyone under 55. I would also love to see silver rider connect to bullhead city az transportation. I know its across state lines but even one per hour would be nice.

The first I learned about this plan was in the October 2nd issue of our local PAHRUMP VALLEY TIMES referring to "community workshops" hosted by your Department last year, which I must have missed while overseeing care of my mother then dying of dementia. It seems she was not the only one suffering forgetfulness as our state government evidently "forgot" about the daily bus service between Reno and Las Vegas running through Pahrump for several years until abruptly cancelled in June, 2018. The proposed intercity corridors do not begin to replace this service, as there is nothing between Tonopah and Reno/Sparks, and Pahrump has dropped totally off the map.

This is more than a slight to Pahrump, having a population several times that of other towns which would be on at least one bus route. And a higher proportion of our population is composed of elderly retirees or injured war veterans who are unable to drive and thus much more dependent on reliable public transportation. Nye County has its own "Regional Transportation Commission" and I am copying one of the three members, Leo Blundo, who also sits on our BOCC, to see if that body can weigh in at this late date about rectifying a serious omission in Nevada's "Coordinated Human Services Transportation Plan".
