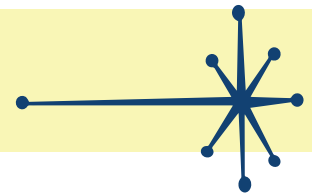

The Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) invites you to participate in a virtual public information meeting for the Downtown Access Project. NDOT is evaluating alternatives to improve safety and improve travel time reliability on Interstate 515 between Rancho Drive and Mojave Road in Clark County, Nevada. Join us to learn more about the project and to provide input on potential solutions. No decisions have been made, but some of the alternatives being evaluated would permanently close some streets that currently go under I-515.

This virtual meeting site will be live for 30 days. During this time, you can view the information when it's convenient for you. The site will take you through why the project is needed, project goals, proposed improvements, alternatives developed to date, and proposed permanent street closures. An interactive map will allow you to view each alternative from 15 different viewpoints along the corridor. You will have the opportunity to provide feedback and ask questions on all elements of the project.

**Your input is critical as it will be used to develop the design alternatives in the next phase of the project.**
