5. Update on SR 28 multiuse path *Karen Mullen*

The multiuse path along SR 28 connect and provides access to areas of Lake Tahoe as well as bring safety enhancements to drivers and pedestrians on State Route 28 An update on the Sr 28 multiuse path and as well as future projects will be given.

6. Presentation of Boulder City complete streets project *Jim Keane, City of Boulder City*

Complete Streets design is an approach or policy used within the transportation industry to promote street networks for all users, not just the accommodation of vehicles. An update on the status of complete street projects in Boulder City will be presented.

7. NDOT Transportation Alternatives Program update *Scott Bohemier*

The Transportation Alternatives Program provides federal funds for community-based projects that expand travel choices and enhance the transportation experience by integrating modes and improving the cultural, historic, and environmental aspects of our transportation infrastructure. An update will be given.

8. Recreational Trails Program (RTP) update *Janice Keillor*

The Recreational Trails Program (RTP) is a Federal-aid assistance program, managed by Nevada State Parks, to help states provide and maintain recreational trails for both motorized and non-motorized recreational trail use, education and planning. An update will be given.

9. Bike Share Program implementation at NDOT *Scott Bohemier* (for possible action)

The NDOT is looking to implement a bike share program within the department for employees to utilize. Action may be taken to provide letter of support for the bike share program
