

Richard Sage is the Director of Construction Management for Sound Transit. As such he oversees all of the construction management activities for the light rail, commuter rail and regional express bus capital construction programs (currently about \$750 million per year).

Mr. Sage has 49 years of experience in construction including 16 years with Sound Transit; 26 years with contractors in the heavy civil / highway construction industry with experience in project management through Sr. Project Manager working on tunnels, heavy civil structures, highways and bridges; 4 years of water/sewer design and property/construction surveys; and 3 years as an officer in the US Army, Engineering Branch.

Mr. Sage is a 1968 graduate of Michigan State University in Civil Engineering and is a Registered Professional Engineer and Certified Construction Manager. He is a Committee Member of the Transportation Research Board Committee on *Construction Management* (2011 to present) and was a Committee Member of the *Tunnel and Underground Structures Committee* (2003 – 2015).
