What is **NEVI**

- National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Formula Program
 - Infrastructure and Investment Jobs Act (IIJA)
- Directs \$7.5B toward EV Charging Nationally
- Focuses on creating a national network of charging infrastructure
- NDOT must submit plans to the DOT and the DOE Joint Office for funding

- Define the methodology for ensuring that NEVI funds in Nevada are deployed strategically alongside other Nevada EV investments to maximize the benefit to communities and the traveling public.
- Apply this framework to bring the existing interstates proposed as Alternative Fuel Corridors (AFCs) to meet the full build-out standards under the current NEVI requirements.

Provide, operate, and preserve a transportation system that enhances safety, quality of life and economic development through innovation, environmental stewardship and a dedicated workforce.




Nevada State Plan for Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Deployment



July 2022

Plan 1

- Approved 2 new stations in collaboration with NV Energy's Transportation Electrification Programs
 - Carson City exact location TBD
 - Jean/ Primm location identified
- Approved upgrades in 3 existing station areas in rural areas to meet "Fully Built Out" status on interstates
 - Carlin
 - Wells
 - Moapa
- Approved for 4 exceptions along I-80 from the 50-mile requirement



Status

Planning

- June 2023 New Guidance Released
- Key Takeaways:
 - State Plans updates are Due August 1 each year to receive that Year's Federal Funding
 - Guidance on Fully Built Out Certification Requirements
 - Clarifications on project and funding eligibilities

Funding

- NDOT's Initial Plan was approved in September 2022
- NDOT is authorized to use FY22 and FY23 NEVI Funds (\$13,703,375)
- NDOT is preparing the Plan Update required by FHWA to receive FY24 funds

- Submit Draft Plan 2 for agency review on July 11, 2023
 - Agency comments due July 14, 2023
- Submit Final Plan 2 by August 2023

Proposed Actions for 2024

- Continue collaboration with stakeholders and communities
- Sites advanced to construction
- Implementation Strategy and Processes in place
 - Industry Outreach
 - Data collection and reporting
 - Justice 40 Tracking
 - Funding reporting
- Update plans as required by FHWA
- Execute individual strategies for each of the NEVI Plan Key Elements



Equity Strategy

- Strategies:
 - Direct spending (measured as a % of stations in DACs)
 - Indirect spending (measured as a % of low-income trips traveling to, into, and through trips)
 - Workforce development (measured as an increase in accessibility to information)
 - Incorporate community input throughout the plan (measured as the number of outreach events)


