5. Discussion on Amendments, Adjustments to the FY 2012-2015 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) document and the development of the FY 2012 - 2021 Transportation System Projects document (Dennis Taylor/Jason Van Havel)

Throughout the year the Transportation/Multimodal Planning Division amends and/or adjusts the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) document to reflect project changes across the state. Development of the Transportation System Projects document, which includes the STIP for the next fiscal year (FY 2013), begins in January and culminates with the draft document being presented annually to the State Transportation Board.

6. (For Possible Action) Formation of the Transportation Alternatives Working Group (Jason Van Havel)

NDOT is in the initial stages of updating its group categories listing for the Transportation System Projects Document (TSP).

With the recent passage of the Federal Transportation Bill, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21), there has been a change in how the former Transportation Enhancement (TE) Program will be administered. It will now be part of a different program known as the Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program. This program includes; Safe Routes to School, Recreational Trails, the former TE and a small portion of the Scenic Byways Program.

A Special STTAC meeting was held on January 7, 2013 to discuss the formation a Transportation Alternatives Working Group. The Working Group would be an NDOT Working Group and not a subcommittee of the STTAC. The focus of the Working Group is to develop the selection and prioritization process for the rural areas, Carson Area MPO and Tahoe MPO. The selection and prioritization process developed by Washoe RTC and RTC of Southern Nevada MPO's will remain under the MPO jurisdiction..

Discussion pursued from members regarding the roles / responsibilities, size, and structure of the Working Group. The STTAC members suggested that NDOT prepare a document outlining the roles and responsibilities of the Working Group to be used as guidance during the Work Group meetings. NDOT requested feedback from the STTAC via email to help define the roles and responsibilities. NDOT will provide a summary received from STTAC members and provide a draft of the roles and responsibilities.

NDOT staff would like to request two representatives from the STTAC along with two representatives from the Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board to sit on this TA Working Group. This group will also include three representatives from NDOT staff.

This group is scheduled to meet at 1:30 on February 4, 2013.

Staff and/or members of this Working Group could provide updates at future STTAC meetings.

7. Discuss Transportation Enhancement Program Funding (Dennis Taylor/Jason Van Havel)

NDOT will provide a handout outlining the current Transportation Enhancement Program with identification of the unfunded projects. The Funding Update will be provided for informational purposes to provide the STTAC members background as to status of the Transportation Enhancement Program and the impacts to the program with the authorization of the Transportation Alternatives Program.

- B Discuss Transportation Alternatives Funding Allocations (Jason Van Havel)
 The Transportation Alternatives Program has consolidated several funding programs.
 The consolidation has impacts to the amount of funding available and the funding status of previously submitted projects. NDOT will provide overview on the current funding and allocation of funds for the Transportation Alternatives Program.
- 9. **Update on the Nevada Recreational Trails Program (Jenny Scanland)**An update will be provided on the Recreational Trails Program . The Program is a Federal-aid assistance program to help states provide and maintain recreational trails for both motorized and non-motorized recreational trail use.

REGULAR STTAC MEETING -

Item 1: Call to Order and Determination of Quorum*

Chairman Joanna Wadsworth called the STTAC meeting to order at 10:03 a.m. It was determined that a quorum was present.

Item 2: Public Comment

None at this time

Item 3: Approval of the December 3, 2012 Regular STTAC Meeting Minutes*

Steve Bunnell made a motion to approve the December 3, 2012 Regular STTAC meeting minutes. Pete Konesky seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Item 4: Formation of the Transportation Alternatives Working Group (Jason Van Havel)

Jason Van Havel, Assistant Chief of Transportation Multimodal Planning, stated that the intention of NDOT is to try to request assistance from the STTAC and the Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board (NBPAB) in forming a group to help direct policy (a process) on how NDOT should be structuring the Transportation Alternatives (TA) Group. The group would consist of three from NDOT, two from the STTAC and two from the NBPAB. The NDOT legal staff stated that it would not invoke open meeting law requirements to form a working group. Keith Norberg questioned the STTAC bylaws regarding forming sub-committees. The STTAC has the ability to form a sub-committee or working group. Jason commented that to form a sub-committee would necessitate the need for open meeting law requirements. Discussion.

*The meeting was suspended briefly due to audio technical difficulties. The meeting resumed.

Dennis Taylor stated that the STTAC was originally formed as an advisory to the State Transportation Board for all projects not just enhancement projects. Keith Norberg commented that when the Enhancement Program began, NDOT needed a process to establish a protocol to prioritize and monitor enhancement projects. Since that time, the bylaws have been revised several times. Tim Mueller read the current bylaws dated April 6, 2009, page four, sub-paragraph E, regarding sub-committees, which states that, "as needed, the STTAC may form sub-committees. To be a member of a STTAC sub-committee, the member shall be a regular or alternative representative of the STTAC." Discussion followed. A handout was distributed regarding TA projects previously submitted (unfunded). The main goal of the working group was questioned. Dennis Taylor stated that the working group would develop the process, streamline the process, verify eligibility of projects, ensure the projects are programmed and delivered on time and prevent projects that have been funded from being "on hold." On the MPO side, the MPOs would continue to use their approved process for selecting and prioritizing their enhancement projects based on their appropriations/allocation of funds available. Those projects would then go before the TA Working Group. The working group would then verify for purpose of auditing, programming and scheduling of funds, that the project is actually eligible for transportation alternatives and it is within the amount available to that MPO. For the rural side, a single application for transportation alternatives would be developed that could be submitted any time throughout the year with a deadline date, and would be considered for funding or for the next fiscal year funding. If it was submitted after the deadline date, it would be carried over for the next fiscal year. This would create a tally of approved projects for the rurals. Dennis stated that he would like to see that if the money is not expended in the given fiscal year, it is similar to other funding where it is carried over to the next fiscal year. If there was a multi-year bill, which is possible when MAP-21 expires, that could also be discussed by the working group. MAP-21 and FHWA outline the allocation of funds. Jason Van Havel commented that the working group will not be a one-time action but will continue to solicit and receive applications, and provide the methodology to review and rank projects.

Randy Fultz questioned if the Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board (NBPAB) has authority over all projects with bike improvements included. Bill Story, NDOT Bicycle/Pedestrian Manager, stated that the statute is specific, that the NBPAB (seven representatives from state agencies/seven members of the public) advise state agencies. MPOs have brought projects before the NBPAB for an opinion at their own discretion. Wes Henderson questioned the members that would make up the working group. Dennis Taylor asked if the STTAC agrees with the overall make up of the working group and questioned if a working group meeting is necessary after the STTAC meeting today. Dennis requested STTAC members submit ideas and suggestions regarding the working group vision, goals, composition, etc. to Tim Mueller and cancel the working group meeting today. Discussion followed. Joanna Wadsworth commented that it would be in the best interest to wait to hear comments back from the members and reagendize this for the next meeting. The next STTAC meeting is scheduled for February 4, 2013.

The 2013 Nevada Legislative Session is set to begin on February 4, 2013. NDOT has six Bills and Bill Draft Requests under consideration:

- AB15 Removes the prospective expiration of the authority of NDOT to use the construction manager at risk method for the construction, reconstruction, improvement and maintenance of highways.
- <u>AB18</u> Revises provisions governing the relinquishment of state highways to local governments and the relinquishment of local roads to NDOT.
- AB21 Clarify statutes relating to accident reports written by law enforcement officers to more accurately reflect current practice and ensures that the exception to the open container alcohol law in taxis, limos and buses does not apply to the driver.
- <u>SB14</u> Authorizes NDOT director to reduce maximum weight limits on certain highways and bridges.
- Budget Bill Allow NDOT to charge user fees for the use of a transportation facility and to pursue public private partnerships.
- Budget Bill Authorize placement of roadside acknowledgement signs for rest area private sector sponsorships in Nevada.

If you hear of any BDRs or bills that may affect NDOT, let our communications director Sean Sever know. We are currently tracking 57 that may affect NDOT.

Mission:

To assist NDOT staff with implementing a model Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP). This program will be a component of the quality of life for Nevada in the future.

NDOT's TAP Vision:

To be a national leader in delivering top quality, efficient and expedited TAP projects geared to improve the quality of life for Nevadans.

Goals:

To recommend TAP policies and processes including addressing legacy issues, to NDOT staff and management for consideration.

To update TAP policies and process as needed in the future.

Develop criteria used to rank future statewide TAP projects that are submitted in future calls for projects.

To review updated TAP rules of procedures (based on a revised update to the TE Rules of Procedure which were reviewed and adopted by the STTAC in October 2011)

Non-Eligible Activities

Due to the changes with MAP-21 Legislation the following project types are no longer eligible: landscaping and transportation museums.

TAP funds can only be obligated for projects submitted by "eligible entities" defined in 213(c)(4)(B) as follows:

- local governments;
- regional transportation authorities;
- transit agencies;
- natural resource or public land agencies;
- o school districts, local education agencies, or schools;
- tribal governments; and
- any other local or regional governmental entity with responsibility for or oversight of transportation or recreational trails (other than a metropolitan planning organization or a State agency) that the State determines to be eligible, consistent with the goals of this subsection.

Eligible Activities: Under 23 U.S.C. 213(b) eligible activities under the TAP program consist of:

- 1. Transportation Alternatives as defined in 23 U.S.C. 101(a)(29) (MAP-21 1103):
 - A. Construction, planning, and design of on-road and off-road trail facilities for pedestrians, bicyclists, and other nonmotorized forms of transportation, including sidewalks, bicycle infrastructure, pedestrian and bicycle signals, traffic calming techniques, lighting and other safety-related infrastructure, and transportation projects to achieve compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.
 - B. Construction, planning, and design of infrastructure-related projects and systems that will provide safe routes for non-drivers, including children, older adults, and individuals with disabilities to access daily needs.
 - C. Conversion and use of abandoned railroad corridors for trails for pedestrians, bicyclists, or other nonmotorized transportation users.
 - D. Construction of turnouts, overlooks, and viewing areas.
 - E. Community improvement activities, including
 - i. inventory, control, or removal of outdoor advertising;
 - ii. historic preservation and rehabilitation of historic transportation facilities;



- iii. vegetation management practices in transportation rights-of-way to improve roadway safety, prevent against invasive species, and provide erosion control; and
- iv. archaeological activities relating to impacts from implementation of a transportation project eligible under title 23.
- F. Any environmental mitigation activity, including pollution prevention and pollution abatement activities and mitigation to-
 - address stormwater management, control, and water pollution prevention or abatement related to highway construction or due to highway runoff, including activities described in sections 133(b)(11), 328(a), and 329 of title 23; or
 - ii. reduce vehicle-caused wildlife mortality or to restore and maintain connectivity among terrestrial or aquatic habitats.
- 2. The safe routes to school program under section 1404 of the SAFETEA-LU.
 - A. Infrastructure-related projects.-planning, design, and construction of infrastructure-related projects on any public road or any bicycle or pedestrian pathway or trail in the vicinity of schools that will substantially improve the ability of students to walk and bicycle to school, including sidewalk improvements, traffic calming and speed reduction improvements, pedestrian and bicycle crossing improvements, on-street bicycle facilities,off-street bicycle and pedestrian facilities, secure bicycle parking facilities, and traffic diversion improvements in the vicinity of schools.
 - B. Noninfrastructure-related activities to encourage walking and bicycling to school, including public awareness campaigns and outreach to press and community leaders, traffic education and enforcement in the vicinity of schools, student sessions on bicycle and pedestrian safety, health, and environment, and funding for training, volunteers, and managers of safe routes to school programs.
 - C. Safe Routes to School coordinator.
- 3. Planning, designing, or constructing boulevards and other roadways largely in the right-of-way of former Interstate System routes or other divided highways.

Ineligible Activities: Section 1103 of MAP-21 eliminated the definition of transportation enhancement activities in section 104 of title 23 and inserted in its place a definition of transportation alternatives, which does not include eligibility for certain activities that were previously eligible as transportation enhancements:



A. Safety and educational activities for pedestrians and bicycles.

Exception: Activities targeting children in Kindergarten through 8th grade are eligible under SRTS (an eligible activity under the TAP funding).

Note: Some of these activities may be eligible under HSIP. Nonconstruction projects for bicycle safety remain broadly eligible for STP funds.

- B. Acquisition of scenic easements and scenic or historic sites.
- C. Scenic or historic highway programs (including visitor and welcome centers).
 - Note: A few specific activities under this category (construction of turnouts, overlooks, and viewing areas) remain eligible under section 101(a)(29)(D) of title 23.
- D. Historic preservation as an independent activity unrelated to historic transportation facilities. Note: Historic preservation and rehabilitation of historic transportation facilities are permitted as one type of community improvement activity; see section 101(a)(29)(E).
- E. Operation of historic transportation facilities.
- F. Archaeological planning and research undertaken for proactive planning. This category now must be used only as mitigation for highway projects.
- G. Transportation museums.
