






### **DISCLAIMER**

The lower, and greater, of the two numbers on the roadway is the average daily traffic volume for all classes of vehicles present in that segment of roadway. The corresponding upper, and lesser, of the two numbers is the average daily commercial truck volume on that segment of roadway. Roadways with no traffic volume marking are under 500 average cars per day.

### Shoulder Width:

A shoulder is the width of pavement outside the fog line on the paved roadway. Shoulder widths are designated by a highlight on the map and indicate areas in which the shoulder (the area to the right of the fog line) is at least 4 t wide. This width may contain a rumble strip.

Rumble strips are used at the edges of vehicle lanes to alert inattentive drivers with vibration and sound that their vehicles have left the travel lane. Many times, these eatures may affect a bicyclist's preferred usable space on the centerline when passing. Cyclists in Nevada can expect rumbles of varying consistency of location and size used throughout the state.

Nevada is the driest state in the US. Locations with available potable water may be great distances apart (in some cases as much as 100 miles or more). Bicyclists are advised to always carry extra water and plan your route carefully.

The weather in Nevada can vary greatly due to abrupt changes in elevation and very low humidities. Daily temperature variations can range 50 degrees (F) or more. The northern two thirds of the state has base elevations of over 4000 feet. Daytime highs in the summer range in the 90s and low 100s (°F) in the north and can reach up to 115° in the south. Winters can be cold with lows around -15° F in the north and the 30s (°F) in the south. Nevada can be quite windy with prevailing winds from the west.

The prevailing winds for Nevada are generally west to east and can be 30-50 miles per hour.

Construction can be expected on Nevada's roadways on a year round basis. Due to the rural nature on many of Nevada's roadways these projects may be many miles in length. While bicyclists are not prohibited through these projects, all roadway users need to obey construction signage and instructions from construction personnel to nsure the safety of everyone concerned.

# Camping in State Parks: The administration of the Nevada Division of State Parks

has issued a policy regarding its parks with campground facilities that ensures all touring cyclists will be guaranteed a place to camp. Fees associated with using the parks and facilities will still apply. This policy provides a level of confidence of touring cyclists that they will not be turned away due to a full campground.
