# US 50 Lake Tahoe Corridor Safety Improvements

Public input sought on proposed future safety improvements along US 50 Lake Tahoe, from the Nevada/California state line to the junction of SR 28

## PURPOSE OF MEETING

The Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) is proposing concepts to enhance safety in this corridor. The purpose of this effort is to identify and evaluate safety improvements for the approximately 11 miles of US 50 from the Nevada/California stateline to the junction of SR 28. Concepts will be presented to include restriping for one through lane in each direction with a center turn lane.

Proposed future safety improvements within the corridor include:

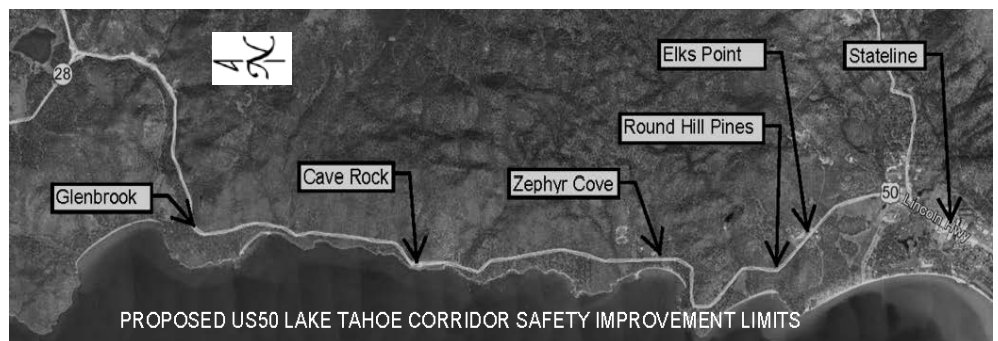
- Roadway resurfacing/restriping
- Lane reconfiguration including bicycle lanes
- Roundabouts
- Bicycle and pedestrian enhancements along the roadway
- Designated turn lanes, Acceleration/Deceleration Lanes, and designated turn out locations for slow moving vehicles
